CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

A BRIEF CONCEPT NOTE

The Indian Himalayan Region is rich in biodiversity and is known as a global biodiversity hotspot with a diverse ecosystem and a rich cultural area. This area has been inhabited by an uncountable number of indigenous/ethnic groups and tribes. The variety in climate and terrain of the Himalayan region has led to different kinds of cultural adaptations that have contributed to an 'ethnographic variety' with a distinct Himalayan worldview and a Himalayan way of life.

However, issues such as climate change, increasing population growth, unplanned urbanization and developmental activities in the Himalayan region are posing a threat to both the environment and society. Presently, the environment in the region is alarming. Loss of biodiversity is of great concern since many plant and animal species are being threatened. Air, water and land quality is going to be one of the critical problems in the region.

Anthropologists have consistently engaged in empirical field-based research with established theories, methods and analytical techniques. In this era of globalization, the industrial revolution, urbanization, the development of information technology and demographic and nutritional transitions, new paradigms of research are being explored by anthropologists and allied disciplines.

There have been significant contributions by a large number of scholars and researchers in Anthropology and allied disciplines in understanding the ongoing issues related to the environment, ecosystem and biodiversity of Himalayan regions and prime human security i.e. food, shelter, economy, health, and education culture including language, art among others that are posing serious challenges for the tribes and other indigenous communities of the region. At this juncture, Anthropology and allied disciplines are equipped to contribute towards developing measures to cope with the abovementioned issues.
