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INTRODUCTION

University of North Bengal has set up virtual classroom in 25 departments to enhance online learning environment which allows for live interaction between the faculty and the students as they are participating in learning activities. In other words, the virtual classroom is a shared online space where the students and the teacher work together simultaneously. Usually, these interactions take place through videoconferencing.

In this type of interaction, the teacher has the particularly important role of the moderator who guides the learning process and supports group activities and discussions.

FEATURES

Advanced interactive whiteboard

Server side recording

- The server-side recording (SSR) works in the background when video conferencing establishes. Five concurrent users can take part in this conferencing. The recording is captured directly on our server. The recording is available in the server Computer Library in MP4 format within minutes of the end of the session. internet speed can impact the recording, very little buffering even on low-end connections. Individual users should make sure that respective computer systems have all the application software installed properly.

Integrated library

- The integrated library supports all types of files, saving the hassle of transferring and carrying data. Upload text, audio, video, PPT, and HTML files in different formats (PDF, DOC, DOCX, XLS, XLSX, PPT, PPTX, MP3, MPEG, WMV, MP4, JPEG, GIF, PNG). The cloud storage saves the hassle of transferring and carrying data. It's easy to search for content and share it with your audience.

Easy administration

- Use of the **TrueConf** software from any browser and set it up within minutes. TrueConf makes it easy and seamless to carry out administrative activities for your live sessions. User can define roles and permissions for individual attendees and manage your ongoing sessions with a host of in-class features.

GENERAL POLICY GUIDELINES

- The devices using in Virtual Classroom connecting to the University network must be registered (in stock) either centrally or at department level.
- The configuration and operation of devices (using in virtual classroom) connecting to the University network must comply with all applicable University security policies, procedures, and practices.
- Individual user/department should ensure that the Operating System Installed in virtual classroom is proper, valid and active. In case of any confusion, installation or reinstallation the only point of contact is Computer Centre.
- Computer Centre subscribes licenses for all Windows Operating System supported by Microsoft and latest version of MS Office through campus agreement. All the departments or users should submit a written request or send a request mail from institutional email id to get these software(s) installed into the computer system
- Recorded lecture stored in Central Streaming Server set up at the Computer Centre. User/department should contact with the Head, Computer Center for retrieve.
- If any devices use in virtual classroom is not in working condition, user/department should inform the Computer Centre.
- The representative of the Computer Centre will inform the vendor on earliest to resolve it and vendor will maintain the call log.
- Computer Centre will determine the technical specifications, installation practices, standards, and operational criteria for newly replaced devices by faulty devices uses in virtual classroom.
